- **I. Purpose:** This contest aims to elevate students' motivation and interest in learning English with the experience of a read-aloud competition.
- II. Organizer: Center for English Language Teaching (CELT), Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages
- III. Date: May 22, 2024 (Wednesday), 15:00-17:00

IV. Registration:

- A. Contestant Qualifications:
 - 1. Undergraduate freshmen in the Day Division of the 4-year college currently taking General English courses from A1a to B1b (non-English native international students included)
 - 2. Registered full-time students
 - 3. Students with no experience staying in any English-speaking country or studying in any English language school (including bilingual or international schools) for over six months.

E. Regulations

- 1. The contestants must report with their student ID cards (or any other valid certificate with a photo) at Q201 or Q202 in between 15:00-15:20 for registration and confirmation of the running order for the contest. Those who do not show up for reporting before the contest (15:30) will be removed from the contest and their related rights will be denied.
- 2. The contestants should dress in appropriate formal outfits.
- 3. Procedure:
 - a. The contestants draw one out of the three assigned reading materials five minutes before their performing time.
 - b. The first bell will be rung once as a reminder when the contestant reads up to 1:50. The finishing bell will be rung twice when the contestant reads up to 2 minutes and the contestant must stop reading.
 - c. The winners will be announced on the spot after the contest. One winner from each English level will be rewarded.
- 4. Criteria for Evaluation:
 - a. Pronunciation and intonation: 30%
 - b. Fluency: 30%c. Delivery: 30%d. Posture: 10%
 - * If the contestants are tied, the ranking will be determined by the scores in Pronunciation and Intonation, followed by Fluency, Delivery, and Posture.

VI. Prizes:

The first place in each level will receive NT\$500 and a certificate.

Note: All contestants will receive certificates of participation.
